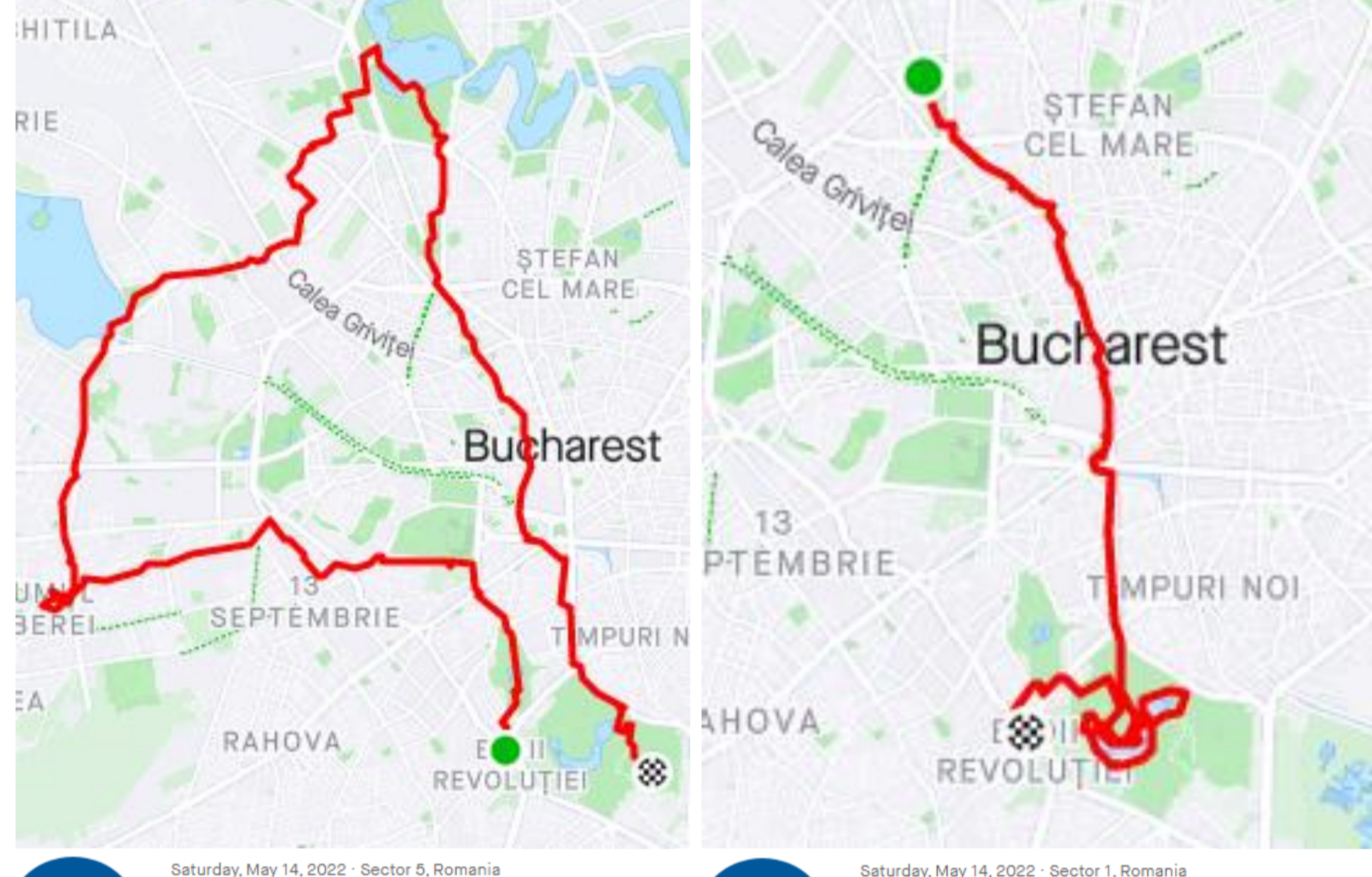

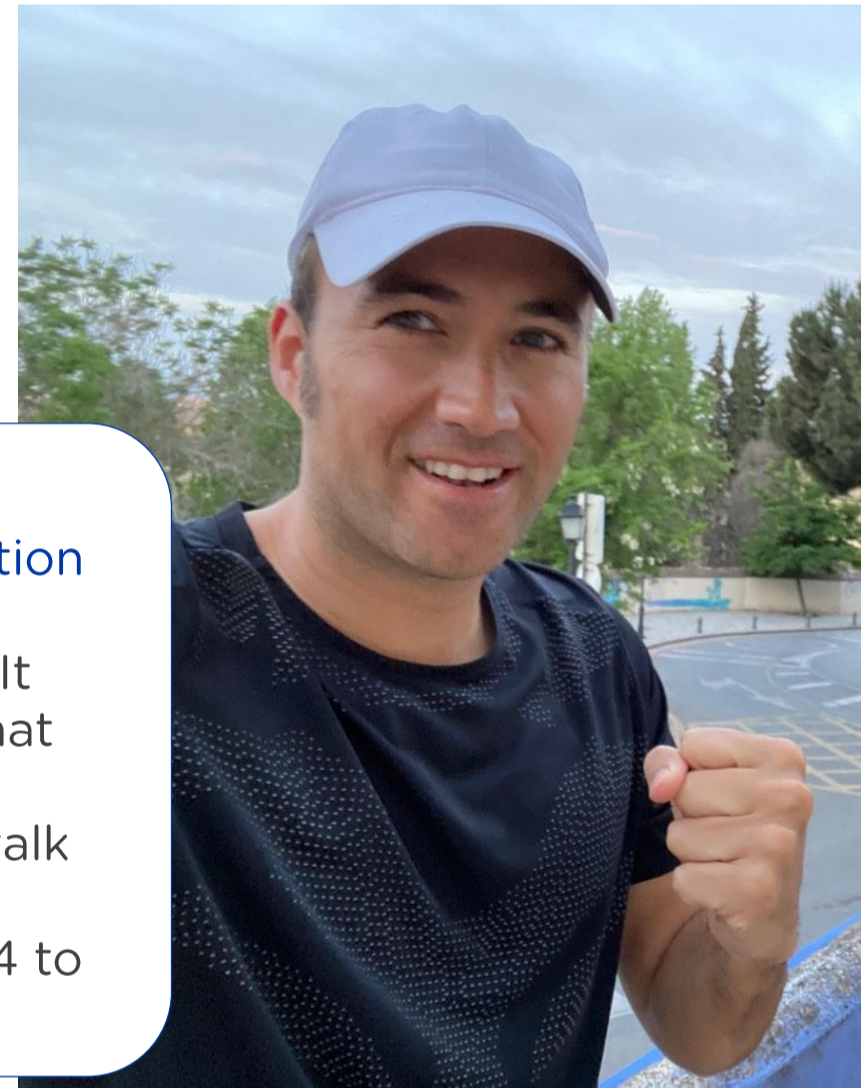


Ranking by market:
